The CMR is a registered, non-profit organisation that focuses on child and family protection. Christian Social Services (CMR) is a well-established and respected child protection organisation in the Eastern Cape Province, which has been providing social and welfare services to communities in need since 1944. The twelve CMR offices provide accessible, community-based developmental and counselling services to people.

CMR Programmes:

We focus on promoting healthy family functioning, as the family is seen as the most important unit within our society.

- HIV/Aids
- Family Preservation programme
- Child protection through statutory services

All services are rendered through

- Group work
- Case work
- Community work

The CMR has assisted a total of 46 registered families during this financial year.

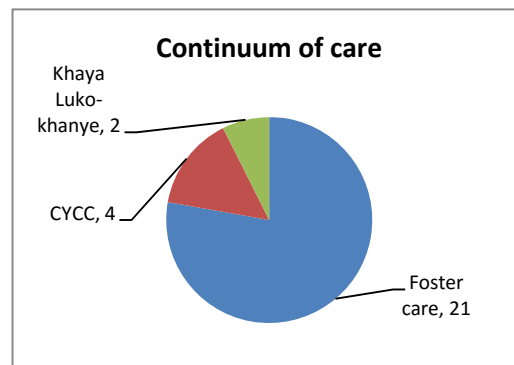
28 families were registered for statutory services, 12 families were helped on a short term basis and 6 families received emotional support.

Statistics:

- 17 files of CMR Drakensberg received
- 2 children received play therapy
- 3 persons received relief packages valued at R317.50
- 1 child is orphaned.
- 1 child is neglected.
- 1 family received support for alcohol abuse.
- 2 persons were screened for foster care.
- 1 person made inquiries for possible adoption.
- 2 Elderly people were emotionally supported.
- 2 Families received marriage counselling and parenting
- 1 person has received support for HIV / AIDS.
- 7 files were terminated and closed.

Through the intervention of the law, children are being secured and stability are accomplished in their lives.

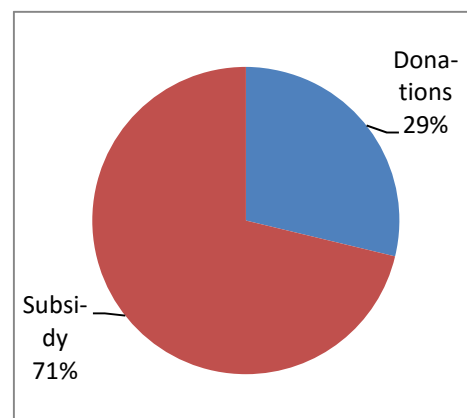
1 parent whose child was removed received family reunification services and there is a possibility that the child will return to the parent.
